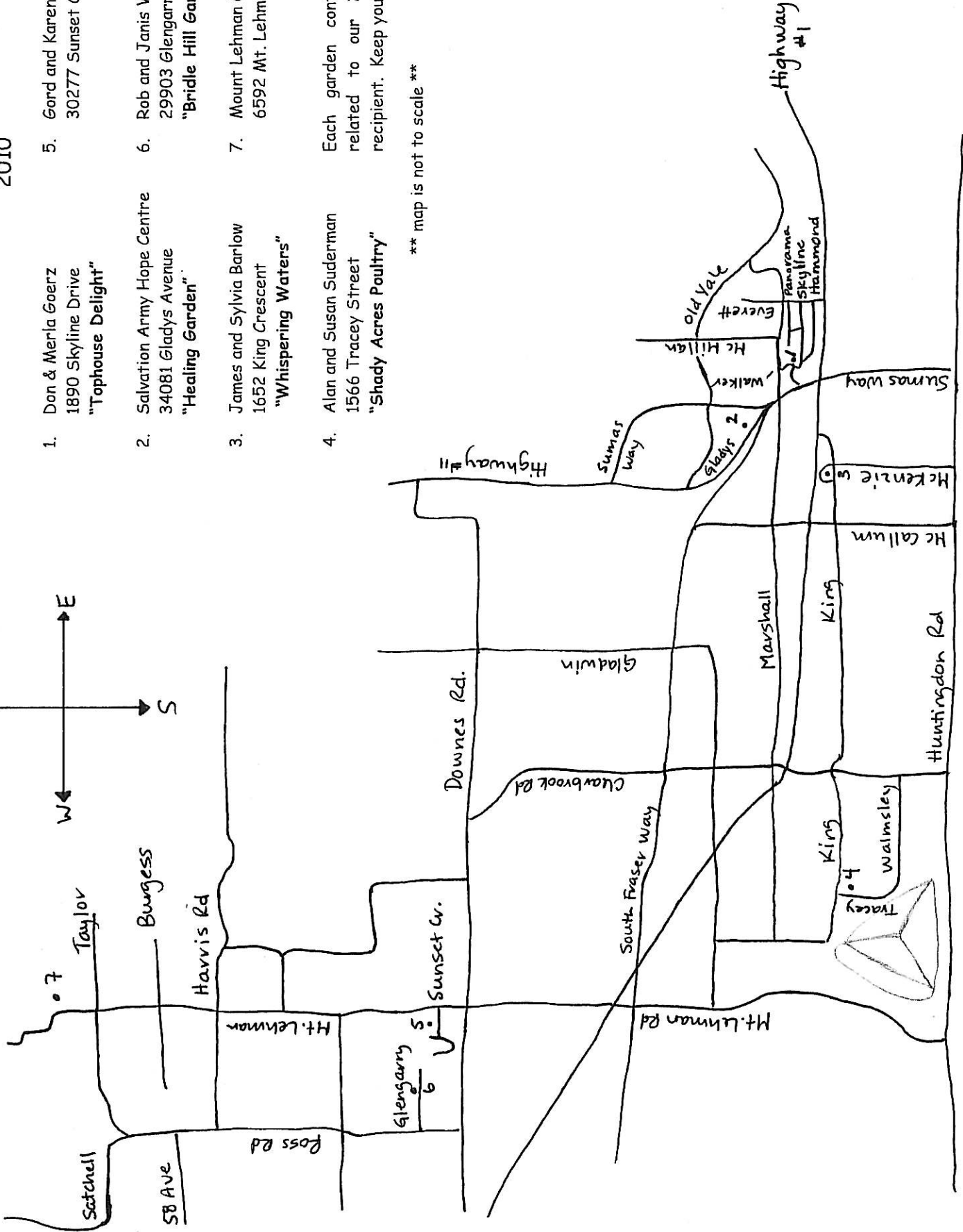
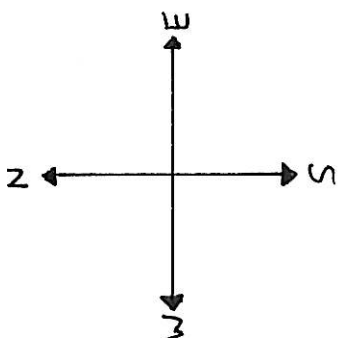

| | <p>Burundi - GOATS AND COWS *This is a \$3- \$1 matched project! - <u>Item: plastic cow and goat</u> Burundi is one of the poorest countries in the world. We're helping families by providing them with healthy goats and cows so that they will have milk, meat and fertilizer to grow their vegetables. Best of all, these animals are vet checked and animal husbandry is provided to ensure their health and growth.</p> | |
| | <p>Guatemala - WOMEN'S EMPOWERMENT *This is a \$3- \$1 matched project! <u>Item: note pad and woven garment.</u> We're helping to empower women who live in very remote regions of Guatemala through literacy training, business training and micro-loans so that they can provide food for their children through small agriculture and weaving business.</p> | |
| | <p>India - PAID IN FOOD - *This is a \$4 - \$1 matched project! <u>Item: watering can ornament</u> We're helping some of India's poorest rural people with food security through building wells, irrigation, roads, etc. Since they are in need of food relief, they are paid in food to build their own infrastructure.</p> | |
| | <p>Uganda - A PLACE AT THE TABLE—Feeding Orphans <u>item: bowl, spoon and cup.</u> Rescued orphaned children who have been abandoned or who have lost their parents are being given a family. We're working to provide food for one boys and one girls group home. There are 8 - 10 children in each group home.</p> | |
| | <p>Haiti - EARTHQUAKE RELIEF - <u>item: A soapstone figurine of a woman and baby.</u> Helping people recover after the January 2010 Earthquake through relief efforts.</p> | |
| | <p>Local Needs - ABBOTSFORD FOOD BANK <u>Item: Bags of rice and Rice Raiser Brochures</u> Over 4,000 people access the food bank each month—50% of those people are children. Hunger hurts no matter where you live especially when one cannot provide for their children. We collect rice and other non-perishable food to assist these families with basic food requirements.</p> | |
| | <p>Hunger Response International - <u>item: globe and bowl of rice</u> Since we give 100% of all designated donations to the global project, we raise support for our work separately. Our two main initiatives include the Rice Raiser Campaign and Have A Rice Day.</p> | |
