Read Luke 15:8-31





Set the scene:

A) Read Acts 4:32-37

³² All the believers were united in heart and mind. And they felt that what they owned was not their own, so they shared everything they had. ³³ The apostles testified powerfully to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and God's great blessing was upon them all. ³⁴ There were no needy people among them, because those who owned land or houses would sell them ³⁵ and

bring the money to the apostles to give to those in need.

³⁶ For instance, there was Joseph, the one the apostles nicknamed Barnabas (which means "Son of Encouragement"). He was from the tribe of Levi and came from the island of Cyprus. ³⁷ He sold a field he owned and brought the money to the apostles.



B) 1 Corinthians 13:1-13 Love Is the Greatest

- 1. Ask this question: "Who is the person you most admire?" (Not including Jesus!)
 - Why do you admire that person?
 - What is his/her most outstanding quality?
- **2.** Did any of the people you admire have "love" as his/her most outstanding quality? Why is love so important?

3. Read 1 Corinthians 13:1-3

¹ If I could speak all the _______ of earth and of angels, but didn't love others, I would only be a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. ² If I had the gift of prophecy, and if I understood all of God's secret plans and possessed all knowledge, and if I had such faith that I could move mountains, but didn't love others, I would be nothing. ³ If I gave everything I have to the poor and even sacrificed my body, I could boast about it; but if I didn't love others, I would have gained nothing. We have been talking about spiritual gifts and yet as you look at these three verses, what good do the spiritual gifts really do without love?

4. Read 1 Corinthians 13:4-7

⁴Love is patient and kind. Love is not ______ or _____ or ______ or ______ ⁵ or ______. It does not demand its own way.
