# **SERMON TEXT DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

# NORTHVIEW COMMUNITY CHURCH

#### **OBSERVATION**

This section is aimed at helping people observe the details of the text: what is written, what words or ideas are repeated and emphasized, the text's structure and how this text fits into the wider context of the book.

- 1. Read Esther 8:1-17.
- 2. What stands out from this text? What seems important to notice?
  - → Esther is given Haman's estate which is then handed to Mordecai along with Xerxes's signet ring.
  - → Esther pleads with the king for Haman's plan to be overruled.
  - → Esther pleads on behalf of her people
  - Xerxes allows Mordecai and Esther to send out an edict with his seal upon it—an edict which cannot be revoked.
  - → The Jews were granted to ability to protect themselves against anyone who opposes them on the thirteenth day of the twelfth month.
  - → Mordecai is given the royal garments to wear.
  - → The new edict brought joy and celebration across the kingdom.
  - → Many people became Jews because of their fear of the Jews

#### **INTERPRETATION**

This section is aimed at linking the current text to other texts or to the bigger biblical narrative.

- 1. Two irrevocable decrees are given in Esther, one which leads to death (3:12-14), and this one which leads to life. This mirrors the predicament we all find ourselves in.
  - a) Skim Genesis 3. How is the situation here similar to that of the edict in Esther 3?

Both have decrees which result in death, among other things

- b) To whom does the curse from Genesis 3 apply? It applies to all people, men and women.
- c) How does Jesus reverse the curse?

Jesus bears the burden of our sin and dies in our place that through him we find life.

- 2. "Many people of other nationalities became Jews..." The prophets and authors of Scripture often spoke of the nations coming before God to worship.
  - a) Read the following passages:
    - 1) Isaiah 2:2-4
    - 2) Jeremiah 3:17
    - 3) Zechariah 8:22-23
    - 4) Psalm 67
  - b) How does the image given in these passages reflect that of Revelation 7:9-10?

#### **APPLICATION**

This section is aimed at helping people apply what we have read in the text to our lives. It is intended to foster more open-ended discussion as people connect the text to their everyday life, and reflect on how it changes the way they think and act.

- 1. God delivers his people from the decree of death with a decree of life for those who believe.
  - a) How did God rescue you from the decree of death?
  - b) What temptations are there to go back to the things which bring death?
  - c) How does Christ bring true freedom from death?
  - d) Do you ever struggle to trust Christ for freedom from sin and death? Why?
- 2. God will bring people from all tribes and nations together to worship him.
  - a) How might the Lord be working in your neighbourhood to bring peoples from all nationalities to worship him now?
  - b) What role might the Lord be preparing you for to share the good news with your neighbourhood?
  - c) As a group, how can you support and challenge one another to reach out to peoples from all nations with the good news?
