## **LUKE: UNEXPECTED - DEVOTIONAL**

## THE SETTING:

The Gospel of Luke is written in narrative form, so we can observe lots of characteristics of storytelling in the text. Read Luke 1:5-25 and look for phrases that describe the setting of the story.

- When did Zechariah and Elizabeth live according to the text? (Who was king)?
- Where does Zechariah serve and where specifically do the events of the story take place?
- Walk through the text and list in point form the events as they happen in order.

Pray in Adoration / Confession / Supplication



THE CHARACTERS: Read Luke 1:5-25

Today we're going to focus on the characters of this story. Who are the people involved and what do we learn about them?

- List what you learn about Zechariah and his wife Elizabeth.
  - What is their lineage?
  - How is their character described?
  - What is the problem they face?
  - What is Zechariah's job?
  - What else do you notice about them from the passage?
- Who is the angel that appears to Zechariah? What do you learn about him?

Pray in Adoration / Confession / Supplication



THE ANNOUNCEMENT: Read Luke 1:8-17

In this passage, the birth of John the Baptist is foretold by the angel Gabriel.

- In verse 14-15, what is unique about this child that will be born to Elizabeth?
  - O Why will many rejoice at his birth?
  - What is he not supposed to drink?
  - O What will he be filled with? When?
- In verse 16-17, what does Gabriel say that John will do? What does this tell you about the people of Israel in these days?

• In verse 17, Luke is referencing prophecy from Malachi 3 and 4, the last chapters and verses of the Old Testament. After these words, there were 400 years in which the people of Israel heard nothing from God through prophets or angels. Read Malachi 3:1, and 4:5-6. What is the significance of Luke/Gabriel quoting these verses in reference to John's ministry?

Pray in Adoration / Confession / Supplication



THE PROBLEM: Read Luke 1:11-25

- The birth and ministry of John addresses two problems.
  - What is Zechariah and Elizabeth's main concern? How is it answered?
  - What is the main concern of the Lord in regards to Israel? What will be John's role in addressing this problem?
- How does the angel's description about John point to both his greatness and his subordinate nature?
- Why do you think that Luke decided to start his account of the gospel of Jesus, with the story of John the Baptist's birth being foretold?

Pray in Adoration / Confession / Supplication



THE DOUBTER: Read Luke 1:11-25

- How does Zechariah respond to the angels announcement? What does this tell you about his faith? (note verse 20)
- How does Gabriel respond to Zechariah's unbelief? What does this tell you about God?
- Notice the contrast of the "I am" statements in verse 18 and 19. What does Zechariah think is significant about himself? What does Gabriel say is significant about himself and how is this connected to his message?
- Reflect: Note what you observed about Zechariah in verse 6 and contrast this to his response to the angel's good news.
  - What characterizes your walk of faith? How do we balance obedience to all the Lord's commands, with faith in His miraculous works? What is your response to the good news that God works miracles and can bring salvation through unexpected or unrealistic or illogical means?
