

PARENT PROMPT WEEK 3

READ ASK WATCH DISCUSS APPLY PRAY

READ

Read the bible passage together with your children.

Isaiah 53

Our desire at Northview Kids is to teach children to become Biblically literate.

“Biblical literacy today is a child’s ability to be ‘at home’ with Scripture—to be comfortable using it; to be able to find his or her way around it; to see it as a source of comfort, joy, and insight. Most importantly, biblical literacy is to see the Bible as God’s story, and because they are God’s children, it’s their story too.”

The first step in getting our kids Biblically literate is getting kids to read the Word of God. Our hope is to equip you, the parents, with the confidence to encourage and support your children in their reading and understanding of God’s word.

ASK

The second step of becoming Biblically literate is being able to ourselves questions from the Biblical text that we just read.

Use these simple questions to help prompt your kids think through what they just read. Sometimes, a simple answer of “I’m not sure” is OK! It’s not the right answer that we’re aiming for but rather, helping our child(ren) critically and thoughtfully think through the words they just read.

What does this story teach me about God or the gospel?

Did I learn anything about Jesus in this passage?

Are there any commands in this passage to obey?

How are they for God’s glory and my good?

Are there any promises in this story to remember?

How do they help me trust and love God?

How does this story help me to live on mission better?
