## Apply to Our Story

- 1) Start by sharing one thing that stuck out to you in this week's lesson OR one question you still have.
- 2) For Aaron + Miriam, it was pride + envy that led them to challenge Moses, and ultimately God. Choose 1 question:
  - a) What kind of things (desire for power, judgment, craving control, pride in own abilities, etc.) lead you to challenge those in authority over you?
  - b) Can you think of a time when you were jealous of someone in authority or wanted their position what did you do?
  - c) In the current lane you've been placed in, what are some ways you can submit to those in authority over you, while submitting to God's ultimate authority?
- 3) Isaiah 40:8 says "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever." If God's Word is our ultimate authority, how ought we to respond? Can you think of a time when God's word was clear and you responded in obedience or disobedience? Does your life reflect a continual submission to His authoritative word?
- 4) Respond to God in prayer using a few verses from David's psalm as a guide:

## <u>Psalm 51</u>

PRAISE + CONFESS:

Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love;
according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.
Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, ASK:

Create in me a **clean heart**, O God, and renew a **right spirit** within me. Restore to me the **joy** of your salvation, and uphold me with a **willing spirit**. The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.
