## **UNDERSTAND THEIR STORY**

As we seek to understand the story of the people of God in this text, we'll look at the problems being addressed and the solution that is offered. Read Php. 1:1-11

- 1. What details do we learn about Paul in these opening verses?
  - a. What does he call himself?
  - b. What emotions is he feeling?
  - c. What are his present circumstances?
- 2. What details do we learn about the recipients of the letter (the church in Philippi)?
  - a. What does Paul call them?
  - b. How does Paul feel about them?
  - c. How are they partners with Paul?
- 3. What goals does Paul have for the Philippian church?

## **CONNECT TO HIS STORY**

Read Acts 2:42-47.

- 1. We learn much about the church in Jerusalem in this short passage:
  - a. What activities are prioritized in the church?
  - b. What are some of the characteristics of this church?

## **APPLY TO OUR STORY**

The Holy spirit leads the mission and ensures that there will be a response to the preaching of the gospel.

- 1. In Php. 1:1-11 we see the deep love Paul has for the church at Philippi, and this affection for the church and other Christians is something we should also see in our churches.
  - a. What are some of the qualities you love about Northview church, either in the congregation or in the leadership of the church?
  - b. What are specific traits, skills, or habits you love to see in the people of your CG?
- 2. Paul loves the church and prays for their growth, and again this is something we ought to imitate.
  - a. Look at your 5 x 5 x 5 list:
    - i. How can you pray for growth in some of the people on your list?
  - b. What is one area in your life you can commit to growing in this year?
    - i. What are some measurable goals or benchmarks on your way to this goal?
    - ii. How can you invite others into this growth journey with you?

Adoration: What can you praise God for, as a result of studying this text?

Confession: What might you need to confess to God as a result of studying this text?

Supplication: What can you ask God for, as a result of studying this text?
