- 1. Read Php. 2:12-18
 - a. What does Paul praise the Philippian church for in this passage?
 - b. What is the main command in this passage?
 - c. What is Paul's contribution to their spiritual growth?

CONNECT TO HIS STORY

- 1. Read Num. 11:1-15
 - a. What is the historical context of this passage? Where was Israel camped previously and where are they going?

- b. The people complain on several occasions:
 - i. What sort of things are they desiring?
 - ii. How does God react to the complaints?
 - iii. What are the complaints a symbol of?
- c. How does Moses react to the challenge of leading grumbling and complaining people?

APPLY TO OUR STORY

- 1. The challenge of Php. 2:12-18 is that Christians are called to do all things without grumbling or disputing, even in an increasingly indifferent and hostile world.
 - a. What is one area in your life where you have struggled with grumbling?
 - i. What sort of situations or events tend to make it easier to grumble?
 - ii. What is one commitment you can make to not grumble this week?
 - b. What is one area in your life where you have tended to dispute with others?
 - i. What makes it easier to dispute with others? When do you find this to be easier?
 - ii. What makes it harder to dispute with others? How can you avoid disputes?
 - iii. What is one commitment you can make to not dispute with others this week?

PRAYER Close in prayer for the confessions of the people in your smaller groups: *Adoration: What can you praise God for, as a result of studying this text?*

Confession: What might you need to confess to God as a result of studying this text?

Supplication: What can you ask God for, as a result of studying this text?
