UNDERSTAND THEIR STORY

In this week's DG, we again learned some facts about the Christian life.

- 1. Read Php. 3:1-11
 - a. According to this passage, what are the potential responses to the gospel?
 - b. What sort of things does Paul list as wrong motives for rejoicing?
 - c. What sort of things are good motives for rejoicing?

CONNECT TO HIS STORY

- 2. Read Gal. 6:12-15.
 - a. What is the motive of those who seek external markers of faith (i.e., circumcisions)?
 - b. What is the eternal marker worth boasting about?

- 3. Read 1 Tim. 1:13-15.
 - a. What was Paul's former manner of life?
 - b. What caused a change in Him?

APPLY TO OUR STORY

The lesson in Php. 3:1-11 is that Christian life is more than knowledge, it means rejoicing in the Lord and in the hope of the resurrection rather than in our own abilities or accomplishments.

- 4. Everyone defines faithful Christian life differently:
 - a. What sort of things do you look for in others to see if they are faithful Christians?
 - b. What beliefs or practices in your life show you are a faithful Christian?
- 5. One of the challenges of Christian life is that we must rejoice in the Lord in all circumstances:
 - a. What are some things in your life that you can rejoice for right now?
 - b. How can you rejoice in the Lord or what He has accomplished in your life today?
 - c. What is a situation or conflict where you are struggling to rejoice in the Lord right now?

PRAYER Close in prayer for the confessions of the people in your smaller groups: *Adoration: What can you praise God for, as a result of studying this text?*

Confession: What might you need to confess to God as a result of studying this text?

Supplication: What can you ask God for, as a result of studying this text?
