UNDERSTAND THEIR STORY

In this week's DG, we again learned some facts about the Christian life and about how we ought to treat our Christian brothers and sisters.

- 1. Read Php. 4:1-3
 - a. How does Paul talk about his fellow Christians in this passage?
 - b. What sort of actions does Paul encourage and exhort among the Philippian believers?

CONNECT TO HIS STORY

- 2. Read Php. 1:27-30
 - a. What sort of things are necessary aspects of the Christian life?
 - b. According to this passage, what is the motivation for faithful living?
- 3. Read 1 Jn. 3:9-10
 - a. What is the key evidence(s) of genuine faith in this passage?

b. In this passage, what sort of things must Christians avoid?

APPLY TO OUR STORY

The lesson in Php. 4:1-3 is that we need to keep Christian life simple, by standing in the gospel and standing together with our Christian brothers and sisters.

- 4. We all need to stand firm in the gospel, which Paul had described earlier in the letter to the Philippians:
 - a. When you share the gospel, what information do you need to include?
 - b. When you share the gospel, what information do you find hard to include?
 - c. What is your experience with telling others the gospel of Jesus Christ?
- 5. Euodia and Syntyche (v.2) had a sharp disagreement, and too often we experience the same sort of thing in our families and churches.
 - a. Think back on a recent disagreement you experienced:
 - i. How did the disagreement start?
 - ii. How was the disagreement resolved?
 - iii. How were you and the other person reconciled (i.e., how were you able to "agree in the Lord?")?
 - b. Christians *must* reconcile and be united with one another, so are there any people you need to be reconciled with right now?
 - i. What is one thing you could do this week to mend this broken relationship?

PRAYER Close in prayer for the confessions of the people in your smaller groups:

Adoration: What can you praise God for, as a result of studying this text?

Confession: What might you need to confess to God as a result of studying this text?

Supplication: What can you ask God for, as a result of studying this text?
