## **UNDERSTAND THEIR STORY**

In this week's DG, we again learned some facts about the Christian life.

- 1. Read Php. 3:12-4:1
  - a. According to this passage, what is Paul's one goal in life?
  - b. According to this passage, what is the Christian hope?

## **CONNECT TO HIS STORY**

- 2. Read Psa. 78:4-6
  - a. What sort of things should we teach our children, or the people we interact with most often?
  - b. What tools does God give us to help us teach others about Him?
- 3. Read Php. 4:8-9
  - a. What are the two key actions in this short passage?

- b. In this passage, what sort of things does Paul want Christian to do?
- c. How does Paul teach these values to the church?

## **APPLY TO OUR STORY**

The lesson in Php. 3:12-4:1 is that we must press on in the Christian life, because the road to rejoicing in Christ *is* by knowing Christ.

- 4. We all need positive examples to follow as we seek to know Christ, and Paul pointed to his own life (v.17) as one such example of someone to imitate.
  - a. Who is someone from the pages of history that you look up to? What do you like about them?
  - b. Who is a (living) person that you look up to? How do you want to be like them?
  - c. What character trait, skill, or experience of the person(s) above do you most want to imitate?
- 5. We all need to endure in the Christian life and press on "towards the prize" (v.14).
  - a. What are some habits or practices that help you press on in the Christian life?
  - b. Who are some people in your life that you could help to grow in the Christian life?

**PRAYER** Close in prayer for the confessions of the people in your smaller groups:

Adoration: What can you praise God for, as a result of studying this text?

Confession: What might you need to confess to God as a result of studying this text?

Supplication: What can you ask God for, as a result of studying this text?
