### “EKKLESIA” Week 4: “For The Nations”

#### GATHER

- Talk about travel! How many countries have you visited? Who has been to the most countries in our group? What’s the furthest place from Abbotsford you have been to? Do you have a trip you’d like to plan or are currently planning? (This question connects to the larger themes of being exposed to people and places outside of our immediate context.)
- If you were at a weekend service, share your takeaways from the message you heard. What was something the Holy Spirit highlighted for you?

#### GROW

This weekend’s message was anchored in **Psalm 96**. Talk through the topic more thoroughly as a group by using the outline below. *Feel free to select a suggested question or two in each section to guide your conversation.*

##### 1. **Understand Their Story**

Read Psalm 96.

- Why should we praise God according to this text? (eg. what does it tell us about who God is & what he has done for us?)
- Who is this psalm encouraging to participate in the worship of the LORD? Does this tell us something about who God is?
- Psalm 96:5 declares, “the gods of the nations are idols”. What does idol worship look like today? How do we know if we ourselves are worshipping idols?
- How does this Psalm connect “worship of God” with “witness to God”? Do we view worship in the same way today? In what circumstances could people be influenced by Christian worship to see God rightly?
- Look at the language of Psalm 96:13. Why is creation rejoicing? Is it hard for us - even as Christians to rejoice for the same reason? Why or why not?

##### 2. **Connect To His Story**

Psalm 96 is a call to declare God’s glory to the nations (96:3). This truth is weaved throughout the whole Bible. *Feel free to select a text/question from this section to process this further as a group.*

Jesus’ “Great Commission” in Matthew 28:18-20 highlights the same scope and urgency of the church’s mission. His command extends to “all nations”. Read Matthew 28:18-20.

- What things does Jesus say about himself? What things are cause for those present to worship? How do these truths encourage us today?

Look up 1 Peter 2:9-10 and notice how we, as New Testament believers, can apply Psalm 96 (verses 1-3 especially).

- When you think of the “marvelous deeds” (Psalm 96:3) or the “excellencies” of God (1 Pet. 2:9) what do you think of from your own life? Share these with your group.

How does Jesus’ global vision impact your view of God?

How does Jesus’ global vision impact your view of others/the world?

## GO

### 3. **Apply To Our Story**

Northview aspires to make more and better disciples, leaders, and churches. Unto what end? Primarily: that God be glorified (as we saw week 1), but also for the good of our city (as we saw week 2), and for the good of one another (as we saw last week), and for the good of the nations. *Feel free to select a section or two to use in your group time.*

Discuss the idea of “mission” and “witness”.

- Are there negative ideas that come to mind from these terms? Why?
- How do you think the nations are being reached through the church in our city? How could they be better reached?
- Are there things you have been involved in or regular practices you have that you would consider “mission” or “for the nations”?

Pray!

- Spend time praying for missionaries serving around the world. You could check out <https://northview.org/global-missions/> to pray for our supported missionaries by name and even send them a note of encouragement!
- All of our activity is unto God’s glory and for our mission to help every person become a “deeply rooted follower of Jesus”. Who are those who don’t currently follow Jesus that you could pray for by name?
