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Looking to be in God's Word? Wanting to study some Biblical poetry? Welcome to our Psalms study! For this workbook we have taken a selection of Psalms that are either quoted or referred to in the Gospel of John in preparation for our future study of John.

We have suggested that you study one Psalm per week. You can do it all at once or take the time each day to read and re-read the Psalm and let the Scripture soak into your hearts and minds. The workbook will walk you through different exercises to facilitate a deeper understanding of the passage, what it says about God, people, sin, and our need for a Savior, and bring you to a time of personal prayer of praise, confession, and supplication. Days 4 and 5 of each week will walk you through the connection to John.

Read **Psalm 22** again and then read through John 19:24 (read vs 1-27 for context) to find this Psalm either quoted or referred to.

- Why do you think John quotes or alludes to Psalm 22 in this part of his book?

- What information or background do you think John is trying to get his readers to understand by quoting this Psalm?

Read **Psalm 34** and fill out the following chart

Read **Psalm 35** and fill out the following chart

Read **Psalm 69** and fill out the following chart

Read **Psalm 69** again and then read through John 15:25 (read vs 1-25 for context); John 2:17 (read vs 13-23) and John 19:28 (read vs 28-37 for context) to find this Psalm either quoted or referred to.

- Why do you think John quotes or alludes to Psalm 69 in this part of his book?

- What information or background do you think John is trying to get his readers to understand by quoting this Psalm?

Day 2

Read **Psalm 78** and fill out the following chart

Read **Psalm 78** again and then read through John 7:38 (read vs 25-44 for context) and 6:31 (read vs 25-40 for context) to find this Psalm either quoted or referred to.

- Why do you think John quotes or alludes to Psalm 78 in this part of his book?

- What information or background do you think John is trying to get his readers to understand by quoting this Psalm?

Day 2

Read **Psalm 82** and fill out the following chart

Read **Psalm 118** and fill out the following chart

Read **Psalm 118** again and then read through John 12:13 (read vs 12-19 for context) to find this Psalm either quoted or referred to.
